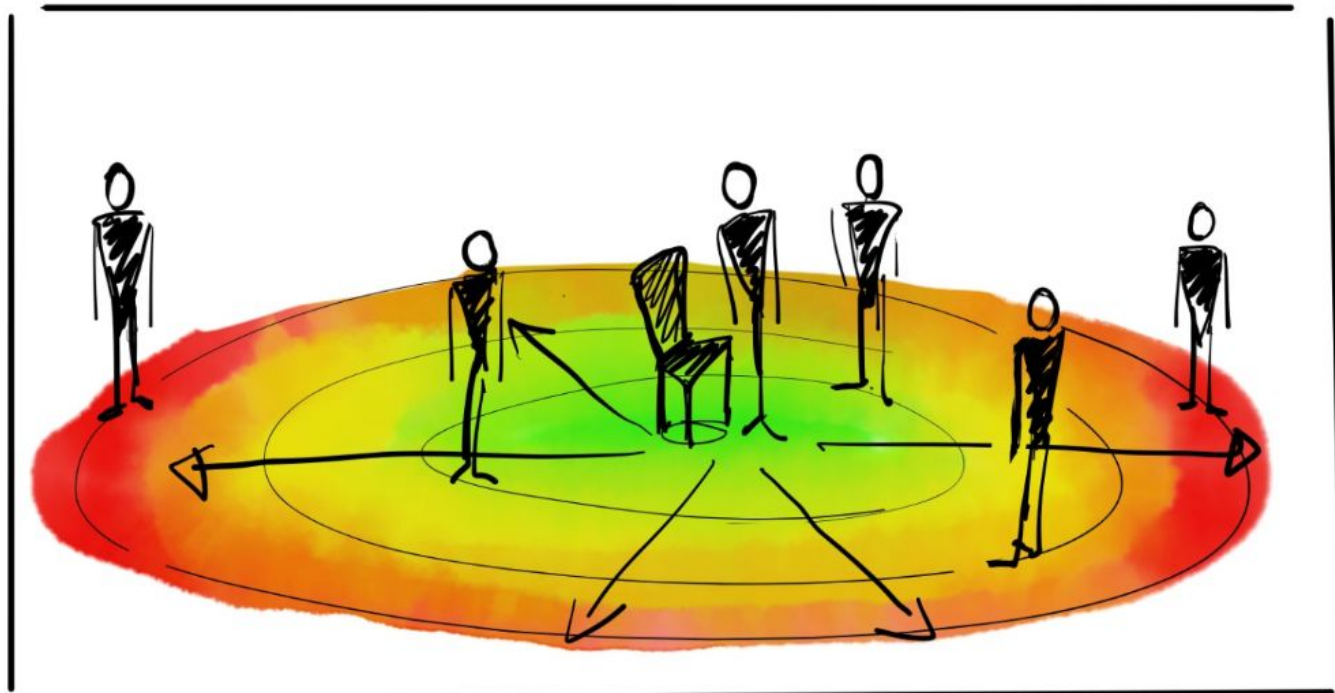

WHAT ARE HUMAN RIGHTS?

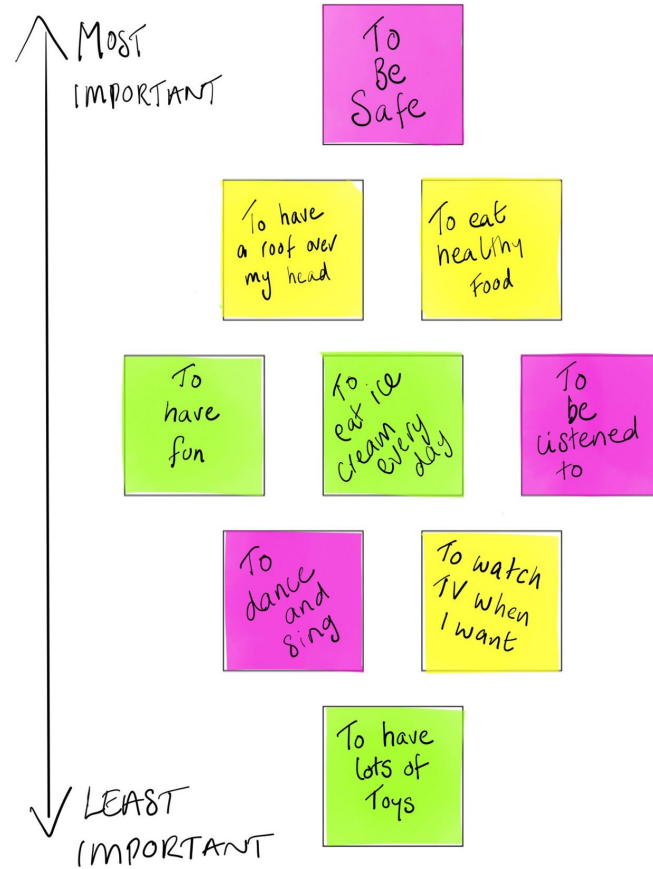

Every child and teenager under the age of 18 is protected by the Convention no matter who they are, where they come from or what they believe in. The Convention protects every child's right to:
